



MAT Program

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT) is one of the most effective evidence-based treatments for opioid addiction and opioid use disorder.

What type of program is this?

This program is an outpatient program that addresses both medical and addiction services under one roof. Our treatment team consists of a licensed independent social worker, recovery counselor, case manager, nurse practitioner and medical doctor.

Are you eligible?

- Must be 18 years or older
- Must have opioid use disorder or alcohol use disorder
- Cannot have active prescription for Benzodiazepine or Barbiturates
- Not necessary to detox prior to initiating services
- Willingness to provide accurate information for continuity of care
- Willingness to actively participate in treatment

What FDA-approved medications are being offered?

Buprenorphine/naloxone (Suboxone) and Naltrexone (Vivitrol)

How do I get started?

Referrals can be made directly by contacting the health center reception and calls will be forwarded to a member of our MAT team. Walk-ins to speak with a MAT team member about the program are welcome.

What can I expect when beginning treatment?

- **Pre-Screen** - by phone or in-person to gather information and determine if our program is appropriate for you.
- **Review of medical coverage and/or sliding fee schedule** - For those eligible, assistance will be provided to obtain medical coverage. For those who are ineligible for medical coverage or have private insurance a sliding fee will be applied.
- **Full Assessment** - meet with a licensed member of the MAT team to complete intake forms, alcohol and drug assessment, and level of care.
- **Referral if Necessary** - if higher level of care is needed, the client will be given alternative resources for treatment and support.
- **Home induction**- initial prescription will be provided for a two-day induction period and then you will follow-up with the doctor for monitoring. At this time if appropriate you will receive a prescription for one week. Length between prescriptions vary based on recommendations from the medical provider.

Is this a medication-only program?

Our program requires participation in behavioral health and supportive services offered by our treatment team, including individual counseling, case management, Recovery Support Groups, and community recovery supports.
